
Site Analysis

The Cedar Creek Master Plan is a project orchestrated by a group of civic leaders in Abilene Texas to capture currently discarded effluent water from the city and recirculate in the creek to increase flows thereby transitioning a little used riparian corridor into a major amenity in Abilene.

This work by Vista Planning & Design was the initial site investigation to promote Vista's understanding of the riparian corridor, the land use context, the history of place, and the dramatic potential spin-off projects that could occur over the next 50 years.

Moving forward in the future, key intersections of the corridor could serve as access points and connections, strengthening area amenities and the tourism experience of Abilene. As a result, Vista sees major potential economic activity as a result of the increased attention on Cedar Creek.





Parks Master plan recommends Kirby Park to be the southern terminus of the Cedar Creek Trail System. This park upgrade was considered to be a medium to high priority.
