
City of Eagle Pass, Texas City Master Plan

Creating a new master plan for the City has taken on a wide variety of specific targeted issues that are important to jumpstart some long range planning currently missing from the City repertoire of tools. This project is launching an entrepreneurial program to address targeted stimulus projects as well as set the stage for the retention of the best and brightest of students from fleeing to larger and more exciting cities. Addressing the Colonias which the City may be compelled to annex in the coming years presents another very complicated challenge. No annexation plan is in place, no subdivision controls, growth by development submittal; all these are being addressed head-on.


