



Shoal Creek Watershed Master Strategy

The Shoal Creek Watershed is the largest urban watershed in Central Austin comprising 13 square miles slicing North to South through the western edge of central Austin. The creek is approximately 11 miles in length and is highly stressed due to the urban activity and land development within the watershed.

This project is less about planning a physical future, but mapping the conditions and developing strategies that can better guide management actions from both a public and private perspective.


Vista is working with the Shoal Creek Conservancy on this ongoing project.
